

Theresa was at a low point in her life the first time she tried drugs. "I was in an abusive relationship and somebody offered them to me," she says. "It was like the miracle cure... it gave me self-esteem."

But what seemed like a "miracle cure" at first soon became a nightmare. Theresa found herself caught up in chronic drug use and abuse... and was even homeless for a while. But at the root of her struggles was the shame she felt that she had witnessed generations of abuse in her family but had still fallen into the same vicious cycle.

After decades of drug use, Theresa's addiction destroyed her marriages and caused her daughters and grandkids to disown her. The day before her 52nd birthday, Theresa finally reached her breaking point living on the cold streets and came to Tri-City Union Gospel Mission in search of a better life.

The day she walked through our doors, everything changed for Theresa.

"At the Mission, the conversation is all based around God," she says, smiling. "There's so much hope... it just keeps me going."

Theresa has found the unconditional love and support of her Christian family at the Mission. "As soon as I walk out of my room, I hear people talking about the Holy Spirit and Jesus. The staff is available day and night. If I need prayer or guidance, they're here."

She was even able to be reunited with her beloved dog of 8 years, Cookie, after getting help to have her classified as a service dog. She hopes to find a place of her own and come back to the Mission to serve as a chaplain to the other ladies.

"I'm grateful the Mission helped me strengthen my faith. Now I'm able to conquer and overcome anything. I work for Jesus now."
