JONNY IS celebrating new life THIS EASTER!

Thank you for touching his life with hope.





"THE MORE I PRAY, THE BETTER I FEEL."

Jonny knows just how important second chances can be. After all, he was given a chance for a new life after spending six weeks in a coma.

His struggles began after his first marriage ended and he turned to drugs to cope with the pain. "My ex-wife was cheating on me and I felt worthless and suicidal. I started trying to numb myself with drugs."

For years, Jonny's life was controlled by addiction. The turning point finally came when he overdosed and ended up in a coma. On Christmas morning, Jonny came out of his coma – stunned but grateful to be alive. But his joy was short-lived because he no longer had a stable home to go to. He ended up living in his car until it ran out of gas, and eventually decided to make a life-changing decision...

"I was in a horrible place – full of self-loathing and feeling like something was missing in my life. I left my car, got on a bus and rode to the Mission."

In our care, Jonny was given the time and support he needed to recover. The overdose left him with physical and mental challenges, like having to relearn how to tie his shoes and other skills that his brain had forgotten how to do.

"Everybody's nice and patient with me because they know I lost a lot of memory and have a learning disability caused by the coma. That helps a lot."

But even more amazing than the physical healing he's found is the spiritual growth he has experienced after accepting Christ as his Savior.

"I've learned that God is going to show me what's right for me on His time... not on my time. I'm learning how to live in a Christlike way."

Your generous support has filled Jonny's life with love, encouragement and, most of all, hope this Easter season. "I feel like I got a second chance at life. I used to think I was a loser and never thought I would become anything again, but now I'm hopeful."

"I realized that everything happens for a reason and God's plan was for me to be at the Mission."
