**S** itting on her bed at the Mission, holding her daughter Zaleya, Jennifer can't believe she once had nowhere to sleep at night.

She was raised in a tumultuous environment, and being misled by people she trusted left Jennifer feeling lost. "I kept getting let down, and I didn't know where to turn when things got out of hand," she shares. To cope with her emotions, she began turning to drugs.

Pregnant and struggling, Jennifer often slept at bus stops. "If someone with bad intentions approached me, at least I could make a visible scene," she explains. Fortunately, concerned friends intervened with good advice: if she didn't find a way off the streets, she'd be putting her baby at risk.

"I needed a safe place – I owed that to my child," she recalls.

# Then, Jennifer found shelter at the Mission, and everything began to change.

"I didn't know what to expect," she remembers. "But the staff made me feel welcome."

Through case management, access to addiction counseling and Bible studies, Jennifer has gone from despair to hope-filled happiness.

"I enjoy striving to meet my weekly goals," she says. "The staff are so great about helping me stay on top of that. I'm more confident now."

Studying scripture is a big part of daily life for Jennifer. "The wisdom I receive from the Bible is my biggest blessing from God."

"What would have happened to us, had I not found the Mission?"



Now that Jennifer is stable, she's doing good things for herself and her daughter. "My plan is to go back to school, work full time and stay focused on Zaleya."

Jennifer is excited to celebrate the restored hope she has been given this Christmas – and wants YOU to know just how grateful she is.

"The Mission never gave up on me. And since I was motivated to change my life, we've made that happen together."
