"I feel like a totally different person!"

Jacy wasn't raised with religion, but she made a high school best friend who introduced her to the Bible. It became the center of their conversations. Just as Jacy was committing her life to Christ, her friend suddenly passed away. Heartbreak sent Jacy spiraling. "I didn't want to talk to God anymore," she admits.

Confused about who to trust, Jacy went on to make poor decisions. She tried to escape by losing herself in relationships with boyfriends, which often lead to feelings of insecurity and abandonment. Without the skills to set healthy boundaries, she was eventually persuaded to try drugs.

After a decade of opioid use, Jacy got into treatment, but realized she had no real support in her day-to-day sobriety. She relapsed, then

found herself in trouble with the law – something she never imagined.

Through a recommendation from the Benton-Franklin Drug Court program, Jacy received a second chance at the

Mission, where she found safety... and hope. "I was scared, but the welcome I felt dashed all my fears."

During her managed short-term stay at the Mission, Jacy was provided with three hot meals a day, safe shelter and the guidance of our staff to help her connect to community resources. Through these services, she's maintained her sobriety and healed from the pain of

her past.

"Going to chapel each day lifted a spiritual blockage and restored my connection to the Lord," Jacy says. She credits her recovery to a supportive, intimate setting and the lasting friendships she's made.

"I'm able to trust and have close relationships once again," she smiles. Passionate about sharing what she was given, she hopes to make a difference in the lives of other women.

Jacy is filled with thanksgiving for God's redeeming love in her life – and your incredible generosity and support! "Although my path to the Mission was painful, I'm profoundly grateful for the experience, and I wouldn't change a thing."
