



"I now see myself as a man of God."

When Morris was a child, both his parents were alcoholics. He was introduced to drugs at age 12. "With the lack of parental guidance, I grew into a functioning addict," he admits. "It had been a way of life."

Although Morris became successful in his career, addiction to drugs and alcohol followed him, contributing to job terminations and legal trouble.

Soon after, Morris was led to the Mission. Although sober, he struggled mentally. "There was built-up depression, guilt and anxiety that I'd been masking," he shares. Morris was assigned a case manager, and together they began to address his challenges.

Through chapel twice a day and with Christcentered support, Morris healed and recovered.



When his marriage fell apart, his addictive behaviors worsened until he lost everything. "Nobody wanted to be in my life," he recalls.

Barely scraping by, Morris found himself sharing a hotel room. One day – his birthday – he came across photos of his grandchildren. Filled with sadness and regret, he broke down.

That same day, his roommate invited him to church. The congregation sang the birthday song to him... a stranger! Overwhelmed by love and acceptance, he answered the call to accept Christ. "In that moment of spiritual awakening, I

Today, Morris is focused on giving back by working with those who are less fortunate. "I've gained humility, gratitude and above all, I've learned a lot about God," he says with a smile.
