

GNOW I REALIZE I'M NOT ALONE.

As a child, Aaron struggled with his parents' divorce, but he was a good student and got good grades. It wasn't until college that he started using drugs and alcohol, which spiraled into addiction.

Since age 23, he felt trapped in a cycle of homelessness, from halfway house to shelter and back to the streets. "It just kept happening again because I couldn't stop drinking," he says.

After living out of his car for a year, he knew he needed help to change, not just for himself but for his family as well. **"I have a 1-year-old son, and the thought of where I would be without the Mission scares me,"** he says. "When they showed me where my bed would be, it was a great feeling because I hadn't slept in a real bed so long."

When he joined the New Life Program, Aaron began to experience real change. "They incorporate the spiritual side of new life in Christ with the practical aspects of recovery," he says. "They helped me set realistic goals and figure out what I wanted to do with my life. That has made the biggest difference."

These tools have set him up for success, especially when paired with a strong community. "You start to see the other participants as brothers. I've learned how to open up and be transparent. You get encouragement from each other in that way."

One of the biggest changes for Aaron has been how he views himself. "Now I know that I do have value. I want to be a good dad for my son. That gives me strength and keeps me moving forward."

This Easter, Aaron is experiencing God's gift of new life! Thank you for empowering him to follow Christ's calling in his life.

FIGHTING THE HOMELESSNESS CRISIS

Did you know? Washington had the sixth-highest homelessness rate in the United States in 2023. The numbers are shocking.

- Personal challenges such as substance abuse, mental health issues, and unemployment need to be addressed *before* being placed in permanent housing. This gradual, structured approach encourages self-sufficiency and reduces the risk of a "revolving door" of housing instability and homelessness.
- Many of the young adults in our community who are currently homeless come from unstable homes where addiction and other risk factors (such as poverty and mental health issues) are prevalent.
- Poor physical and mental health and substance abuse can be causes, and *consequences* of homelessness.
- Unfortunately, as the affordable housing and homelessness crisis grows, community organizations like ours are also struggling. From keeping frontline staff to rapidly rising insurance and other operational costs, **we need your support more than ever.**
- The need in our community is great. But together, we can make a lasting difference!
